

Mitchel Winick, JD



Mitch Winick has served as Dean of Monterey College of Law since August 2005 and was named President and Dean in 2010.

Prior to moving to Monterey, Mitch served as the Assistant Dean for Texas Tech University School of Law and as the Executive Director and Education Director for the Texas Center for Legal Ethics and Professionalism. He also served as an adjunct law professor at University of Houston, University of New Mexico, Southern Methodist University, and Texas Wesleyan University. During his tenure as Education Director for the Texas Center for Legal Ethics Mitch developed the Center's first on-line continuing legal education programming and was also the presenter and producer of many of the Center's initial on-line courses. Mitch promoted the importance of technology in the practice of law by developing law school courses in law-related technology, courtrooms of the future, and ethical rules for using technology in law practice. Mitch developed several early law school pilot programs using distance education, including one semester when he taught the same law school course at both Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas and the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He traveled to each school on alternating weeks, teaching live in one location and broadcasting live over the Internet at the other location. More recently he has taught International Law as a visiting professor using Blackboard.com at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey and the UN University for Peace in Ciudad Colon, Costa Rica.

Dean Winick has always believed that there are many interesting things that can be done with a law degree . . . and only one of them is practicing law. During his thirty-year professional career, his experience has included a mix of law, legal education, and business. Prior to focusing his career in legal education, he served as an Assistant Attorney General of Texas, vice president of a publicly traded company, and partner in a management consulting firm.



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
